Shingles, dead animals or railway ties

Accepted items:

Compost & yard waste (May 15-Oct 15)

Wood (clean non-toxic)

Household furniture

Household hazardous materials (cleaners, bleach, hair products, etc.)

Oil product waste (used oil, oil filters, oil containers)

Antifreeze

Paint (aerosol cans and buckets)

Batteries (car, rechargeable & non-rechargeable, cell phone, etc.)

White metals (appliances, fridges, freezers etc)

Tires (off the rim)

Electronics

Home Reno waste (drywall, painted/stained lumber etc.)
