By-law No. 73.7;

Being a by-law of the Village of Thorsby for the purpose of closing a portion of the public highway in accordance with Sections 175 and 177 of the Municipal Government Act, Chapter 246, Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1970, as amended to June 2nd., 1972.

Whereas, the lands hereafter described are no longer required for public travel, and,

Whereas this land would make a suitable residential lot and Council is desirous of selling it as such, and,

Whereas, notice of intention of the Council to pass a by-law has been served/mailed by registered mail to persons or assessed owners of the land abutting upon the portion of the highway so proposed to be closed at least two weeks before the date fixed for the passing of the by-law, and,

Whereas, notice of intention of the Council to pass a by-law has been published in the 'Leduc Representative' on May 30th., 1973 and on June 6th., 1973 the last of such publications being at least two weeks before the day fixed for the passing of the by-law, and,

Whereas, Council was not petitioned for an opportunity to be heard by any person prejudicially affected by the by-law

or

Whereas Council was petitioned for an opportunity to be heard by the following persons stating that they would be prejudicially affected by the by-law:

Now therefore, be it resolved that the Council of the Village of Thorsby does hereby close the following described highway, subject to rights of access granted by other legislation or regulations;

That portion of 4th., Street West as shown on registered plan number 4451 H.W., (Municipally known as 54th., Street) specifically that portion lying north of 2nd. Avenue North (Municipally known as 53rd. Avenue) and South of the lane lying north of lots 1 to 6 inclusive.

Given first and second reading this 27th., day of March, 1973.
